



The Wedge-tailed Eagle, a significant Noongar totem,
is a symbol of strength, beauty and inspiration,
showing the way, illuminating the path.
Soaring above the earth,
gliding effortlessly through the sky,
the Eagle offers a unique perspective on country.

Walitj Meil (*eagle eye*) **Walk Trail** is an easy-to-moderate 1km loop which starts at the trailhead in the Porongurup National Park Castle Rock day-use area just past the Granite Skywalk sign. Follow the trail markers southwest along the edge of the forest up a gentle rise to a panoramic view of the Stirling Range (**Koi Kyeunu-Ruff**). The path veers southeast through the forest and then northerly finishing the loop near the **Mighty Marri** tree. A quote by 19th century botanist Baron F.V. Mueller cites the Karri as the **Grandest Tree**. Noongar stories, including the legend of bush gossip **Chitty Chitty** (Willie Wagtail), are told. A few of the many bird species found in the Park are highlighted in **Bush Melodies**. Read about the ancient walking worm with 15 pairs of legs in **Relics**. A small portion of this remarkable timber country was first set aside to be conserved and protected in 1926. A photo of guests at the official park opening is featured in **Declaration**.
